CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Communion, also called the Lord's Supper, is the family meal of Christians. We invite all baptized followers of Jesus Christ to participate. If you are not a follower of Jesus or are not prepared to share in the meal, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer. We hope this time is helpful to you as you consider your relationship with Jesus Christ and with his people, the church.

INVITATION TO THE TABLE

DISTRIBUTION OF THE ELEMENTS

Beginning at the front of the sanctuary and working our way back, worshipers may move out of their row toward the east aisle (Manse side) of the sanctuary. Everyone MUST be masked to participate as they come to the table.

At the front of the church in the east aisle, there is a hand sanitizing station where you can sanitize before approaching the table.

As you come to the table, the trays will be uncovered and you may take a cup containing a piece of bread and move across the table to take a cup of juice.

Please return to your seat down the west aisle (Parking lot side) and hold the elements until everyone that wants to participate has received them.

The pastor will invite the participants to remove their masks only long enough to partake of each element. There will be trash receptacles at each door exiting the sanctuary and everyone will be asked to dispose of their own cups.

NEED PRAYER? From 12:00 PM until 1:00 PM, Monday through Friday, someone will be available to pray for anyone in need of prayer. The time will also be focused on praying for the ministry of our church and for God's Spirit to be at work in our midst. WE NEED YOU! There are currently many areas of service and leadership that you may be able to fill. Some areas of need are immediate and can be done during this time of COVID and limited in person activities, others are more strategic and longer term. Ministries such as "WeCare", children's ministry, social media, diaconal programs, teaching, and more all have needs. If you know of someone that you believe would make a good elder or deacon, we would encourage you to speak to that person and encourage them towards that ministry. Also speak to one of the elders or the pastor about them and let us know so that we can follow up as well.

The SALAAM CENTER is hoping to bless immigrant families with Christmas gifts and bags of food/hygiene items this year. They still have about 30 families with children to be "adopted." It would involve buying a "fun" gift (not clothes, up to \$20) for each child and providing a bag of food/hygiene items for the family. If you would like to adopt a family(ies), please let us know what number of kids you would like. The Salaam Center will then send you the first names of the family members, and the gender and ages of the kids.

They also need bags of food/hygiene items for about 25 couples/individuals. The suggested items for the food bags are: flour, sugar, basmati or jasmine rice, olive or cooking oil, tea or coffee (American is fine), and nuts of any kind or a special holiday treat. You could add hygiene items, like shampoo, toothpaste, deodorant, etc. or other small kitchen or household items if you'd like. If you'd rather collect food/hygiene items and have the Center make up the bags, no problem.

The Center would like to have items by December 14th, so there's time to fill in any gaps. If anyone who would like to help deliver gifts and food, the Center is planning that all of it will be delivered over 2 days, either the two days before Christmas or the weekend (maybe Friday, Saturday) before Christmas. (This will keep many people from calling or coming to the Center to see when they'll get their gift.).
