Responsive Call to Worship

- Leader: Praise be to the Lord, to God our Savior, who daily bears our burdens.
- People: Our God is a God who saves; from the Sovereign LORD comes escape from death.

LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLE - Litany of Peace

Leader: Why do we light the Advent candles?

All: The light reminds us that Jesus is the light of the world who comes into the darkness of our lives to bring newness, life and hope.

Leader: What is the meaning of the second lighted candle?

All: The second lighted candle is the candle of Peace. It draws attention to the longing of God's people for a Messiah to come and lead them to victory over their enemies and to bring them peace.

Leader: What is "peace"?

- All: Peace is much more than just the absence of conflict or warfare. The Bible calls it "shalom" which means universal flourishing, health, wholeness, soundness, harmony and delight, in other words, "the way things ought to be".
- Leader: Isaiah prophesied that the Messiah would be the Prince of Peace. How is Jesus our Prince of Peace?
- All: The New Testament proclaims that Jesus is our peace, having reconciled us to God by his death on the cross. He came and preached peace to those who were far away and peace to those who were near, and through him we have access to God the father.
- Leader: Since Jesus has come and brought us peace with God, what are we still waiting for?
- All: Our world is not yet fully redeemed. We await Jesus' second advent when Isaiah's prophetic vision will be completely fulfilled and the crooked will be made straight, the rough places will be made smooth, flowers will bloom in the desert, the wolf will lie down with the lamb, weeping will cease, the foolish will be made wise, the wise will be made humble, humans will beat their swords into ploughshares and death will be ended. Things will finally be they way they ought to be.

CHILDREN'S SERMON

SCRIPTURE FOR THE SERMON

Acts 20:17-38

17 Now from Miletus he sent to Ephesus and called the elders of the church to come to him. **18** And when they came to him, he said to them:

"You yourselves know how I lived among you the whole time from the first day that I set foot in Asia, 19 serving the Lord with all humility and with tears and with trials that happened to me through the plots of the Jews; 20 how I did not shrink from declaring to you anything that was profitable, and teaching you in public and from house to house, 21 testifying both to Jews and to Greeks of repentance toward God and of faith in our Lord Jesus Christ. 22 And now, behold, I am going to Jerusalem, constrained by the Spirit, not knowing what will happen to me there, 23 except that the Holy Spirit testifies to me in every city that imprisonment and afflictions await me. 24 But I do not account my life of any value nor as precious to myself, if only I may finish my course and the ministry that I received from the Lord Jesus, to testify to the gospel of the grace of God. 25 And now, behold, I know that none of you among whom I have gone about proclaiming the kingdom will see my face again. 26 Therefore I testify to you this day that I am innocent of the blood of all, 27 for I did not shrink from declaring to you the whole counsel of God. 28 Pay careful attention to yourselves and to all the flock, in which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to care for the church of God, which he obtained with his own blood. 29 I know that after my departure fierce wolves will come in among you, not sparing the flock; 30 and from among your own selves will arise men speaking twisted things, to draw away the disciples after them. 31 Therefore be

alert, remembering that for three years I did not cease night or day to admonish every one with tears. **32** And now I commend you to God and to the word of his grace, which is able to build you up and to give you the inheritance among all those who are sanctified. **33** I coveted no one's silver or gold or apparel. **34** You yourselves know that these hands ministered to my necessities and to those who were with me. **35** In all things I have shown you that by working hard in this way we must help the weak and remember the words of the Lord Jesus, how he himself said, 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.'"

36 And when he had said these things, he knelt down and prayed with them all. **37** And there was much weeping on the part of all; they embraced Paul and kissed him, **38** being sorrowful most of all because of the word he had spoken, that they would not see his face again. And they accompanied him to the ship.
